
Business development and research are key areas for cooperation. In addition, climate change, health, culture, and children and youth are given priority. Some of the support is contributing to the Estonian government's efforts to integrate the Russian-speaking minority.

A total of seven Norwegian government agencies and institutions are involved in implementing these programmes and in recruiting Norwegian project partners.

EUR 7.1 million Research and Education





ABOUT THE EEA AND NORWAY GRANTS

The EEA and Norway Grants have their basis in the EEA Agreement. Under this agreement, Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway are part of the European internal market. The agreement sets out the common goal of working together to reduce social and economic disparities in Europe and strengthening cooperation between European countries. Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway have allocated a total EUR 2.8 billion to 15 EU member states for this purpose for the period 2014-2021. Norway provides almost 98 % of this funding.
