







Working Together for a Green, Competitive and Inclusive Europe

EUR 102.1 million has been allocated to a number of cooperation programmes with Latvia through the EEA and Norway Grants. These programmes are designed to strengthen cooperation between Norway and Latvia and to promote social and economic development in Latvia.

Cooperation in the area of justice and home affairs will be continued, with a focus on the correctional services and the fight against economic crime. Regional Baltic cooperation will be established in the field of research and education. Other key areas are climate and environment, local development, culture and civil society.

Eight Norwegian agencies are involved as partners in developing and implementing the programmes, and are providing assistance with the recruitment of Norwegian project partners.

ABOUT THE EEA AND NORWAY GRANTS


The EEA and Norway Grants have their basis in the EEA Agreement. Under the Agreement, Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway are part of the EU's internal market. The EEA Agreement sets out the common goal of working together to reduce social and economic disparities in Europe and strengthen cooperation between donor and beneficiary countries. Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway have allocated EUR 2.8 billion to 15 EU countries for this purpose over a period of seven years. Norway provides just under 98 % of this amount.

The EEA and Norway Grants are an important tool in the Norwegian Government's active European policy, which seeks to promote a green, competitive and inclusive Europe.
