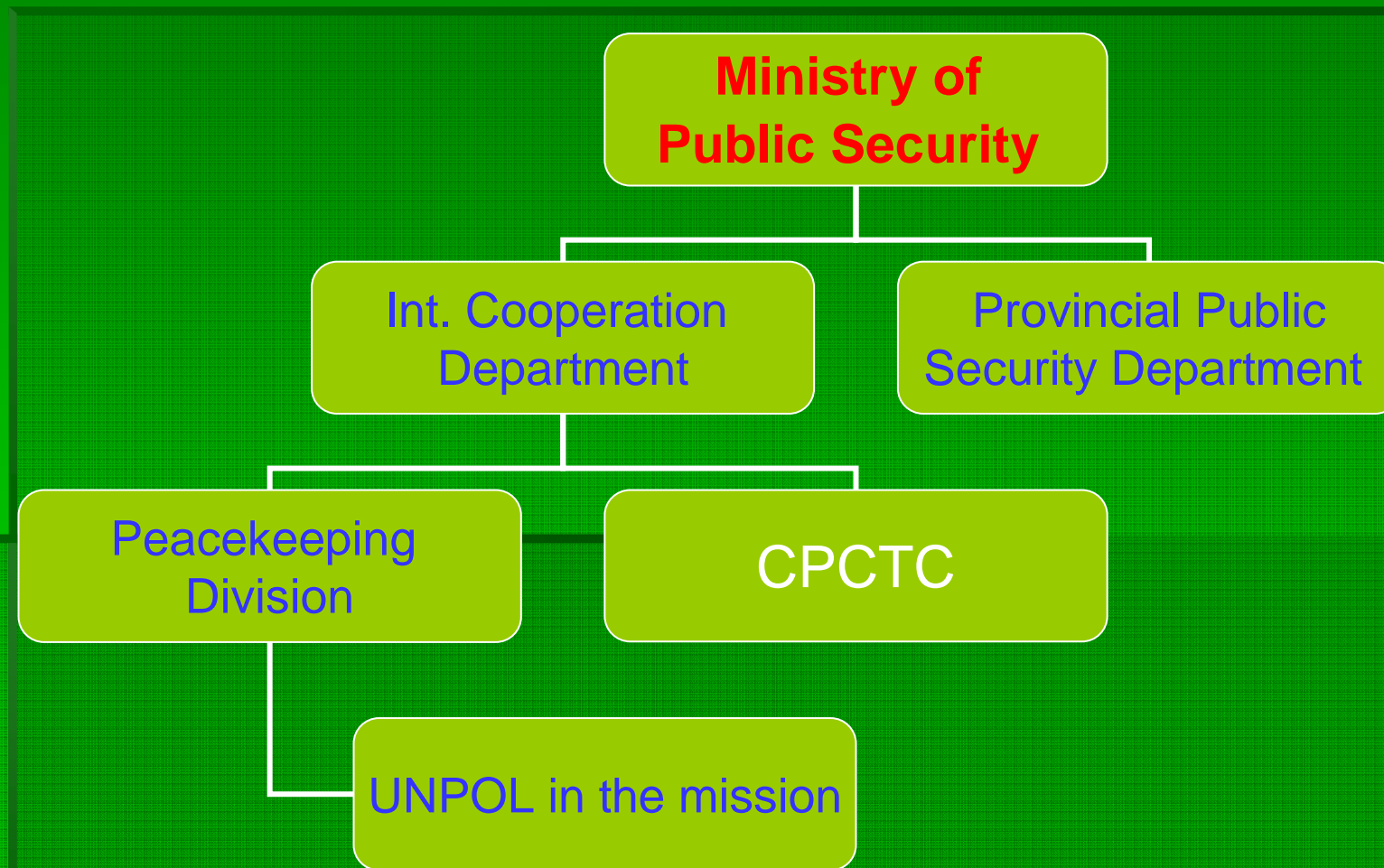

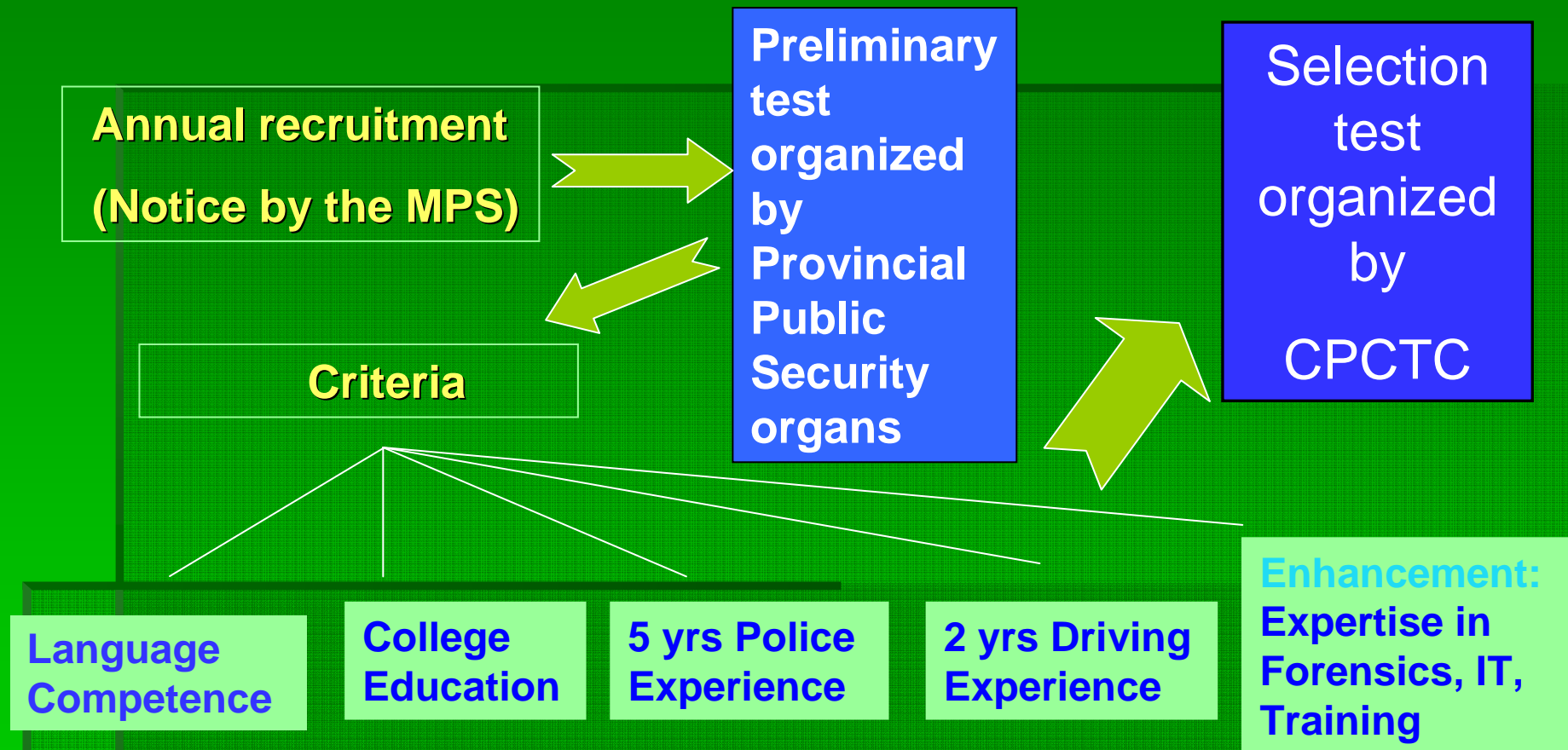

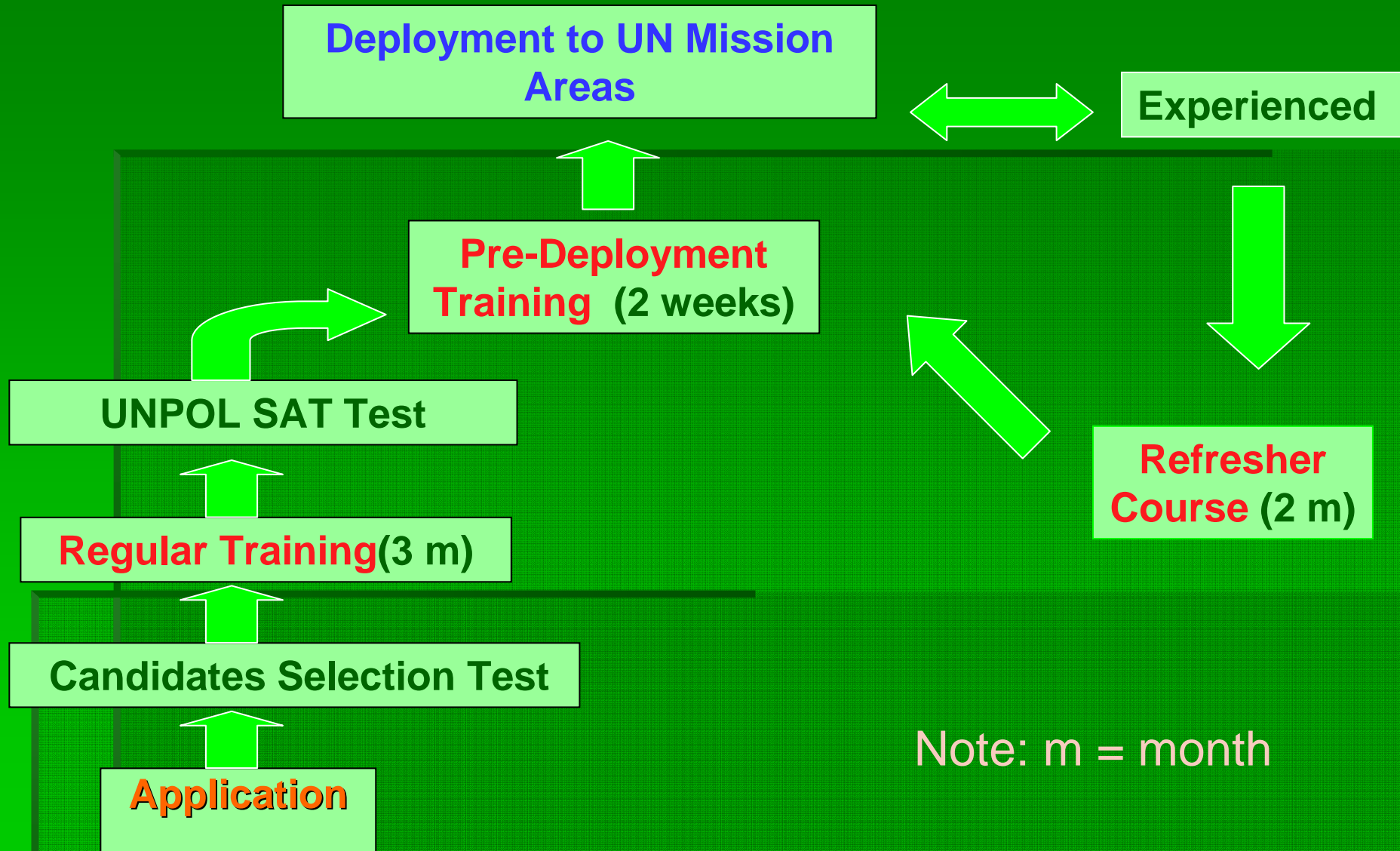

UNPOL Course

- **Basic skills:** English/French language, driving, weapon handling and shooting
- **UN SGTm-centered package:**
 1. Introduction to UN and Peacekeeping
 2. Code of conduct
 3. Human rights and law enforcement
 4. DDR
 5. Humanitarian assistance
 6. Reform and restructuring
 7. Census and identification
 8. Community Policing
 9. Radio communication
 10. Negotiation and mediation
 11. Gender equality
 12. Security awareness
 13. Stress management,
 14. Media relations

FPU Training

Two (2) Phases

- **First Phase: 1 month**
- **Separate course for different groups**
 - Commanders: to study about mission and task
 - HQ Staff: to focus on language study
 - Logistics and Support Staff: to familiarize with new equipments, facilities and weapons
- **Second Phase: 2 months**
- **Collective course for the whole unit**
 - *to be continued*

FPU Course

Operational:

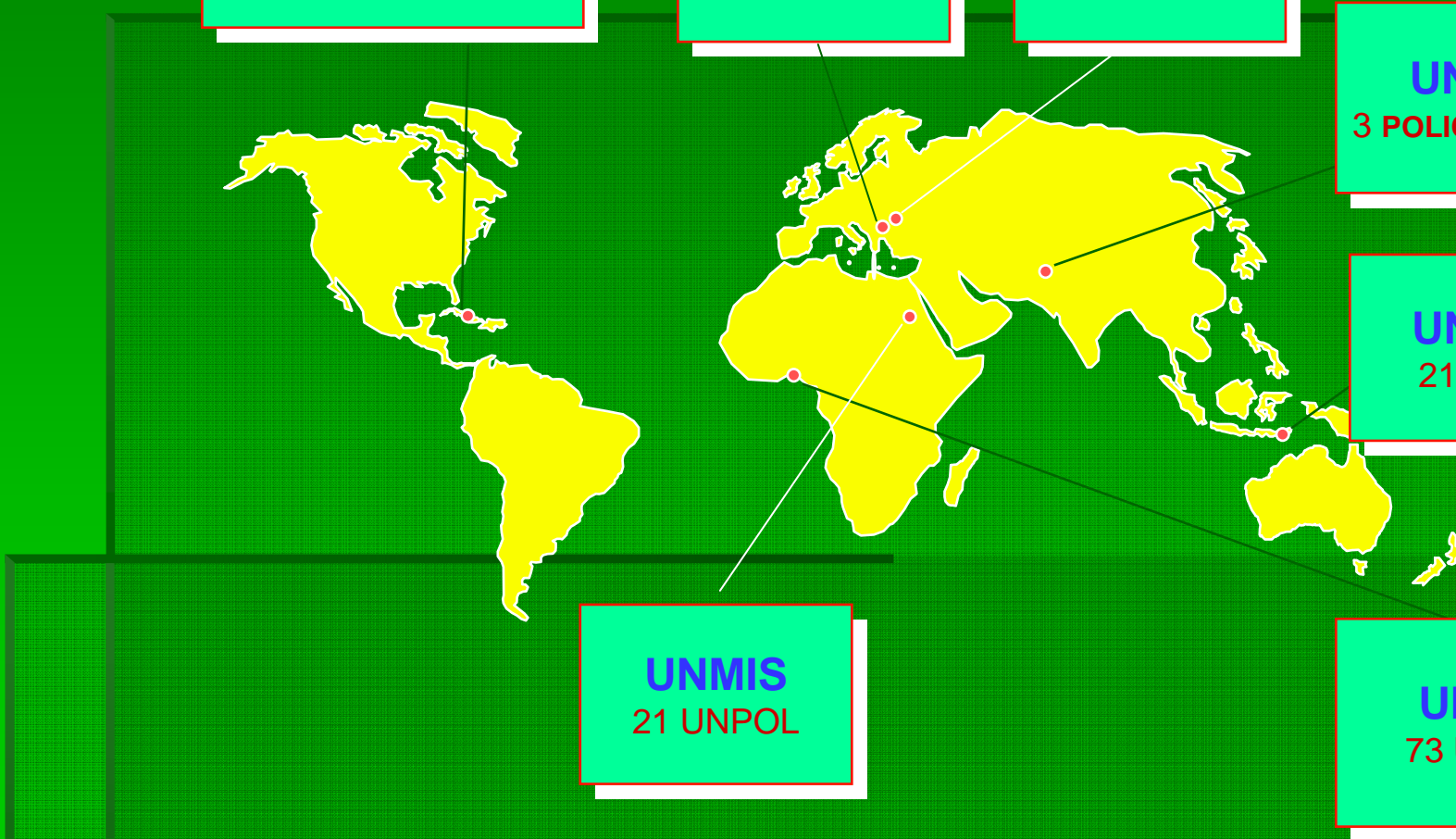
